RE: Off Highway Vehicle Grant Program

As required by California Code of Regulations, section 4970.05(e), notice is hereby given that Shannan Moon, Sheriff-Coroner of Nevada County, will apply for an Off Highway Vehicle (OHV) Enforcement Grant from the California State Parks OHV Division. The grant, in the amount of \$59,830, will be used to provide OHV law enforcement patrols in the Greenhorn Creek, Steephollow Creek, Chalk Bluff, Deadman's Flat, Jackass Flat, Town of Washington and the Bowman Lake areas of Western Nevada County. Patrols conducted along Highway 20 and the Interstate 80 corridor will include Bear Valley, Indian Springs and Rattlesnake Mountain. Patrols in Eastern Nevada County will include Meadow Lake, Boca Reservoir, Prosser Hills, Prosser Pitts and Little Truckee Summit areas.
