Status Update:

- Turning Point does not have Client First Name's new cell phone and is unable to reach her by phone.
- Although there is an AOT order in place, Client First Name has refused to participate in the treatment plan or in any interaction with Turning Point.
- Client First Name continues to refuse any medication interventions although Dr. xxxx has recommended Invega and has stated that she does not believe Client First Name's symptoms will get any better without medication. In the past, Client First Name's symptoms were greatly decreased with medication interventions and she was able to function well. Each time she became better, she discontinued the medication stating that she did not need them. After discontinuing her medication the symptoms returned.
- Client First Name ... describe recent problem or successful behaviors
- Client First Name is not leaving her
- Client First Name is running out of food and is unable to leave the house to get groceries.

Primary issues leading to the AOT referral:

- Lack of awareness of severe mental illness and associated symptoms, has led candidate to disengage from prescribed mental health treatment
- History of severe agitation, anger and aggressive actions has led to criminal justice involvement for disturbing the peace and assault
- Recent eviction and need of permanent housing

Treatment Goal #1: Consistently utilize psychotropic medications, at the prescribed dosage and frequency.

Treatment Goal #2: Participate in Assisted Outpatient Treatment 3 or more times a week to reduce risk factors that lead to hospitalization or crisis contacts.

Recommendations:

Based on the information that points to further decompensation unless there is some medication intervention, it is recommended that Client First Name be evaluated at the hospital. She appears to be gravely disabled at this time.
