WEEKLY ORGANICS Green Cart



- Non-waxy food-soiled paper, i.e. pizza boxes, paper plates, napkins, and paper towels. Paper bags may be used as liners for the bin
- Bread, rice, pasta
- Coffee grounds, coffee filters, tea bags
- Cooked meat and bones
- Dairy products, eggshells
- Fruits and vegetables
- Yard waste, such as grass, brush, tree trimmings, and untreated wood



Unacceptable items: Compostable bags, plastic bags, recyclables, liquids, hazardous waste, raw meat, construction debris, treated wood, and invasive weeds such as blackberry and Scotch broom.



EVERY OTHER WEEK RECYCLE Blue Cart



- Clean and dry plastic bottles, jugs, jars and containers
- Glass jars and bottles
- Aluminum and metal cans
- Flattened cardboard, clean and dry paper
- Cold and hot coffee to-go cups



Unacceptable items: Hazardous waste, yard debris, animal waste, plastic bags, window glass, diapers, mirrors, ceramics, clothing, napkins, carpet, food waste, foam cups, packing materials and food-soiled items, waxy or plastic coated paper products, such as milk cartons.



WEEKLY TRASH Black Cart



- Compostable bags and plastic bags
- Snack and chip bags, candy wrappers
- Juice pouches
- Waxy or plastic-coated paper products, such as juice and milk cartons
- Plastic wrap and film
- Broken glass and mirrors
- Diapers and pet waste
- Hoses, cords, wires
- Styrofoam packaging materials and cups
- Single-use items, such as plastic forks, disposable gloves



Unacceptable items: Organics and recyclable items, hazardous waste, electronics, batteries, tires or paint.
