REGISTRATION: Course registration will begin promptly at 0700 hours on the first day of class. Training days are 8.0 hours with lunch breaks.

COURSE CONTENT: This course is designed to provide basic motorcycle skills to law enforcement officers for on and off-road enforcement. The course helps to develop the student's skills necessary to safely operate a law enforcement Dual Sport motorcycle on and off road. This course will familiarize students with basic braking on asphalt and dirt as well as collision avoidance maneuvers, riding over obstacles, ascending and descending hills, and vehicle stops off road. This is a 40 hour training course.

PREREQUISITE: Students must hold a valid CDL with M-1 endorsement. Must have 12 hours of pre-academy training before attending the class. It is highly recommended that attending students have beginner to novice off road riding experience.

CERTIFICATION: This course is approved under P.O.S.T. Plan IV. Completion certificates will be awarded.

TUITION:

Tuition is \$ 750.00 per student. Invoice will be sent to Agencies after the training has been completed. (**** SDSO student's tuition is covered by Sheriff's Training budget ****).

EQUIPMENT/SUPPLIES: Students will need to provide their own motorcycle and fuel card. Students shall provide the proper motorcycle safety equipment to include off road helmet, goggles, sunglasses, long sleeve shirt, off road riding pants or uniform, duty gun belt, boots (off road motorcycle boots are acceptable), gloves. A personal hydration is strongly encouraged.

DRESS: Police training uniform for off road enforcement identifying markings with gun belt, vest, and jacket. Training will be conducted regardless of weather conditions.

PARKING: Parking is available in the Student Parking Lot at the Facility. Secure motorcycle storage available on site.
