Crisis Intervention Behavioral Health Training for FTO

Course Description:

As a supplement to the basic field training officer course, Field Training Officers appointed on or before January 1, 2017, are required to receive eight (8) hours of additional crisis intervention behavioral health training. Field Training Officers appointed after January 1, 2017, are required to complete this training within 180 days of the assignment.

Field Training Officers who have completed a 40-hour crisis intervention behavioral health training course are exempt from the above requirement.

This course includes topics of understanding and reducing stigma; understanding the cause and nature of, and having the ability to distinguish between, mental illness, intellectual disabilities, and substance use disorders; developing the appropriate language usage for interacting with distressed persons; understanding appropriate responses in handling various situations involving distressed persons; and becoming familiar with conflict resolution and de-escalation techniques.

Additionally, the course will provide the trainee with the minimum topics mandated by Senate Bill 29 and California Penal Code Section 1315.28(a)(1).
